PEF Grants Program



Applications now available!

The PEF Grants Program is the signature program of the Peabody Education Foundation. Every year the PEF offers funding to teachers and schools to provide their classrooms and students with programs and resources that fall outside of the normal school budget. Applications are submitted to the PEF Grants Committee for consideration and approval. Funding is provided through the generous donations of our community and local businesses. Since 1985, the Peabody Education Foundation has worked endlessly to raise over \$1M from within the community to bring innovative programs to our public schools!

Highlights of 2023-2024 PEF Grants Program

- Applications are now available August 1 instead of the first day of school.
- Applications will continue to be accepted on a rolling-basis until February 1, 2024, based on availability of funds.
- The application process is now completely electronic and on-line! No paperwork!
 - o Just log on to the PEF website and go to the updated PEF Grants Program page.
 - o All receipts and invoices will also be submitted electronically.
- The PEF Grants Program continues to offer two kinds of grants:
 - o Individual teacher's grants increased from \$1500 to \$2500 cap limit!
 - o School-wide grants \$10,000 cap limit
- For the first time, there are two grant categories:
 - Creative Learning innovative, creative and academic based
 - o HOPE/Sense of Belonging mental wellness based.
- If you have never filled out an application, there is now a sample application on our website to help you out!
- You will need to notify your principal that you are filing an application, and your principal will also receive a copy of your approval/rejection letter.
- We will be listing applications on our website page that are being funded on a continuous basis so other teachers can see what kinds of programs we fund! Check out our Grants Program website page!
- When issuing any publicity or press release, please give credit to the PEF for supporting your project.
- Remember to send us photos of your program/project so that we can share it with social media and on our website.

Birthday Books Program



Happy Birthday, Students!

Many children from within our City come from homes where books are not readily available. The objective of the Birthday Books Program is to help children and families see books as valuable treasures and treats that can be enjoyed as presents and shared with the entire family. The Birthday Books Program hopes to foster a love of reading and books, promote family time together and help families to realize the importance of having books in the home to read again and again.

Each elementary school has a member of the teaching staff who is coordinating the ordering of books for their school. Books ordered cover all grade levels, are high interest and represent the cultures and diversity of the students. Books are distributed by each elementary school to their own students with a Happy Birthday sticker included inside each book. Over 3000 students are now able to take their own birthday book home every year and share it with their family!

In 2021, the PEF teamed up with JB Thomas-Lahey Foundation to fund the Birthday Books Program for every elementary school student in Peabody! Because of the generous funding from our sponsor, the Birthday Books Program is now a permanent part of the Peabody Education Foundation's commitment to our children! Every year, every elementary student will be able to bring home that special birthday book!

Guest Reader Program



Reading to our students is key!

The Guest Reader Program is for students in kindergarten through grade 5. Every year, from January to May, business leaders and local community members spend 20 to 30 minutes per week in an elementary school classroom reading aloud to the children. The Program is intended to expose students to the pleasures of reading and to present a positive reading role model. Reading to children brings enjoyment to both the readers and the students, and reinforces the idea that reading is fun for everyone.

Teachers can pick out the books they want read to their classroom, or they can leave it up to the Guest Reader to choose the books. And teachers work with the Guest Reader to determine the best day and time for them to read

Once again, the PEF is exploring new initiatives to assist the Peabody School Department and our students, teachers, and parents with Mental Wellness.

The PEF Mental Wellness Initiative is pleased to announce that the "Kids Kindness Club" will be coming to all elementary schools beginning this fall! The Club is part of Connor's Kindness Project, a nonprofit out of Lynnfield that was started during the pandemic to remind us that there is good in the world even at times when we are faced with conflicts and challenges. The ongoing goal is to help others while also spreading positivity, one act of kindness at a time. The "Kids Kindness Club" is a way to bring kindness to schools and lead students on their way to helping others with small acts of kindness and familiarize them with community service. Materials include: the Kindness Pledge, List of Challenges, and a Kindness Club Certificate upon completion. An assembly will be held in each school to kick off the Kindness Club.
