

Blanket Project

For the second year, the Peabody Education Foundation has sponsored the Blanket Project.

Teacher Jill Houlden from the McCarthy School originally started the blanket making project several years prior for students in need during the holiday season. This year, recognizing the substantial need across the entire district, the count of blankets surged to over 100.

Over the past several weeks, volunteers throughout the community came together to assemble the handmade tie fleece blankets in time for the holidays. The blankets were distributed by the schools to students in the elementary schools, the middle school, and the high school.

PEF Books Programs



New "First Book Club" Program for Grades K-2 this year!

This year, the PEF welcomes a new program, the "First Book Club", which is being funded by the Rotary Club of Peabody in conjunction with a District Grant from Rotary. The First Book Club will take the place of Birthday Books in Grades K-2. The focus in this area is going to be on Dr. Seuss books which will be given as a gift to each child with a special reading day on Dr. Seuss' birthday when Rotarians will join forces with our guest readers to celebrate reading.



Birthday Books Program for Grades 3-5

Many children from within our City come from homes where books are not readily available. The objective of the Birthday Books Program is to help children and families see books as valuable treasures and treats that can be enjoyed as presents and shared with the entire family. The Birthday Books Program hopes to foster a love of reading and books, promote family time together and help families to realize the importance of having books in the home to read again and again.

Each elementary school has a member of the teaching staff who is coordinating the ordering of books for their school. Books ordered cover Grades 3-5 this year, are high interest and represent the cultures and diversity of the students. Books are distributed by each elementary school to their own students with a Happy Birthday sticker included inside each book.

Guest Reader Program



Students Love Guest Readers!

Planning for the Guest Reader program is well underway. Applications have been received from over 50 teachers and 50 prospective readers and confirmation letters have been mailed to all readers and teachers. The program will officially kick off on January 13 and run through May 23, 2025.

Business leaders and local community members will spend 20 to 30 minutes per week in an elementary school classroom reading aloud to the children. The Program is intended to expose students to the pleasures of reading and to present a positive reading role model. Reading to children brings enjoyment to both the readers and the students, and reinforces the idea that reading is fun for everyone.

Mental Wellness Initiative



Working to keep minds healthy!

Once again, the PEF is exploring new initiatives to assist the Peabody School Department and our students, teachers, and parents with Mental Wellness.

In October, Motivational Speaker "Jim Basketball Jones" visited the Peabody elementary schools to deliver inspirational school assembly programs for all grade levels. His engaging and highly interactive

school assemblies have made Jim one of the most sought-after school assembly in the country and one of the most recommended assemblies from the PTO / PTA Leadership Facebook Group. His "whole brain" presentation style along with his strong knowledge about current topics make him a highly effective school assembly. Jim's assemblies bring joy and happiness to schools with a powerful message. It is an impactful, fun school assembly that left our STAFF and STUDENTS feeling inspired and motivated. Jim's presentation highlighted anti-bullying, focusing on kindness, inclusion and tolerance. Students learned how to be an "UpStander," standing up for and including others. This was a fun and engaging assembly that focused on KINDNESS. Students were encouraged to "Do Something Kind" and take action to support other students.

New exploratory science program for 4th & 5th graders!

The PEF is funding this district wide program in the 4th and 5th grades in all elementary schools. This yearlong program conducted by the SciSci staff in conjunction with our teachers is an exploratory science program that is very experiential in nature. Students are brought together to work on various science activities in a group setting. The program addresses both STEM and mental wellness as students work collaboratively in a social setting.
